

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The Future of CLCC

Notes and News from October 10, 2023

We had a great turnout of 25 people come out to hear our invited speaker, Mike Caplan. His engaging personality and candidness made it an enjoyable presentation. Thank you to Peter Pelke for inviting and arranging for Mike to present. Mike is the Fox 32 morning meteorologist and a professional photographer. He and his wife own Caplan Studios Photography. <u>https://caplanstudios.com</u>

Mike stated his first job was at Great America as the Amazing Alfredo, where he guessed people's age, weight or month of birth. He saved enough to purchase his first camera, a Minolta XG-7 film camera, and his passion for photography began. When his son was born, he purchased a digital Panasonic Lumix. He then later owned a Canon 5D Mark IV. He now shoots with a mirrorless Canon R5 and also likes using the iPhone. His wife is also a model and photographer.

Over the years he developed his skills in digital photography and along with his wife, now own Caplan Studios Photography. They are hired to take photos at weddings, senior portraits, commercial work as well as dramatic images of the natural world. Mike has taught photography at the College of Lake County and district 128 in Libertyville, where his courses on smartphone photography in particular are extremely popular. The Caplans are well-traveled and devote most of their vacation time to trips designed to build their portfolio of spectacular photos. They've recently fallen in love with Door County, Wisconsin, where their printed work may be found at Articipation Gallery in Sturgeon Bay. They have a studio space at home with artificial lighting. Mike shoots portraits, landscapes, weddings. He highly recommends Iceland for a travel tip. He felt his experience in front of the camera as a weatherman helped him on the other side of the camera. He has three rescue dogs, Isis, Ramseys and Regan.

Mr. Caplan shared over 50 photos he has taken ranging from food photography, weddings, flowers, birds, models, jewelry ads with models, landscapes, portraits, northern lights and an AI portrait of his wife.

Some of the names he mentioned were Ethical Images for photography trips and <u>Replica Surfaces</u> to purchase backgrounds to shoot.

He then answered members' questions:

- Speed light outdoors what intensity? Mike said it depends on how close you are to the subject. If it's sunny, move in closer to subject. If modifier, soft box or umbrella, might use two speedlights.
- What is your time devoted to TV and photography? He said 85% is TV and 15% is photography. He recommended looking at Ben Schurk https://shirkphotography.com for sports photos and Mark Bryant for portraits in Missoula Montana https://www.bryantphotographics.com
- Tips for shooting lightening? Set up on a tripod, use a series of a couple second exposure or shoot video and get a frame grab
- Advice to less experienced photographers is to master your equipment and know the exposure triangle of ISO, shutter speed and aperture
- What mode do you use most to shoot? In sunlight, aperture, if bright, 200 or less. If using speedlights, use manual mode. For freezing action, use shutter priority.
- Mr. Caplan's favorite subject to photograph is people.
- He developed his clientele through social media and word of mouth.

Tips and Snippets

PAY ATTENTION TO THE LIGHT - the single most important part of photography

- What direction is light coming from
- Is the light soft, harsh, high in the sky or low
- In front of you behind your subject
- Behind you in front of your subject
- From the side unwanted shadows, unflattering angle



NIKON D7000 + 105mm f/2.8 @ 105mm, ISO 800, 1/320, f/3.2

TAKE YOUR TIME - slow down - move your feet

- Are your camera settings current or left over from the evening before
- Check your shots while you still have time to redo them, reset your camera better, or move to another position
- Get higher Get lower
- Is a rock or tree branch that you didn't notice in your shot move
- Animals generally look best when you are eye level with them get down

Of the Earth

Now Open!

Five large-scale sculptures by Polish American artist Olga Ziemska will be created exclusively for a new exhibition at The Morton Arboretum, <u>Of the Earth</u>.

The exhibition will explore the artist's expression and philosophy that, she says, "We are nature." Ziemska said that her aim is to remind people that "everything in life is derived from the same basic elements that form everything in nature, including ourselves. There is no separation." In Polish, Ziemska means "of the earth."

The artist's work will be created from reclaimed tree branches and other natural materials gathered from various locations throughout the Arboretum's 1,700 acres. "I am giving reclaimed natural materials a new life and transforming them from nature into new forms," Ziemska said.
